A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish public-private partnerships for the treatment and research of post-traumatic stress disorder.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS FOR THE
4 TREATMENT AND RESEARCH OF POST-TRAU5 MATIC STRESS DISORDER.

6 (a) PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.—Subject to
7 the availability of appropriations for such purpose, the
8 Secretary of Veterans Affairs may seek to enter into
9 agreements with entities described in subsection (b) to col10 laborate on one or more of the following:

(1) Treating veterans with post-traumatic
 stress disorder.

3 (2) Researching the causes of post-traumatic4 stress disorder.

5 (3) Researching innovative treatments of post-6 traumatic stress disorder.

7 (b) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—An entity described in this
8 subsection is a university, hospital, or other similar entity
9 that treats or researches post-traumatic stress disorder.
10 (c) APPLICATION.—In order to enter into an agree-

11 ment under subsection (a), an entity described in sub-12 section (b) shall submit to the Secretary an application13 in such form and containing such information as the Sec-14 retary may require.

(d) INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.—The Secretary shall
include in an agreement entered into under subsection (a)
policies regarding the ownership of any intellectual property developed as a result of research conducted under
such agreement.

20 (e) TERMINATION.—The authority under this section21 shall expire on September 30, 2013.

(f) POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER.—In this
section, the term "post-traumatic stress disorder" includes
mental health disorders directly caused by the non-diag-

nosis, misdiagnosis, non-treatment, or mistreatment of
 post-traumatic stress disorder.

3 (g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 4 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section 5 \$20,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2011, 2012, and 6 2013.
