A BILL

To establish an America Rx program to establish fairer pricing for prescription drugs for individuals without access to prescription drugs at discounted prices.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; PURPOSE.
- 4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the
- 5 "America Rx Act of 2010".
- 6 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of this Act is to estab-
- 7 lish an America Rx program that utilizes manufacturer
- 8 rebates and pharmacy discounts to reduce prescription

drug prices to those residents who are without access to 2 discounted prices for outpatient prescription drugs. 3 SEC. 2. AMERICA RX PROGRAM. 4 (a) Establishment.— (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after 6 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 7 of Health and Human Services shall establish a pro-8 gram (in this section referred to as the "America Rx 9 program") consistent with the provisions of this sec-10 tion to provide qualified residents with access to dis-11 counted prices for outpatient prescription drugs 12 through rebate agreements that the Secretary has 13 negotiated with prescription drug manufacturers. 14 (2) Outreach.—The Secretary shall provide for— 15 16 (A) outreach efforts to build public aware-17 ness of the program and maximize enrollment 18 of qualified residents; and 19 (B) simplified eligibility procedures and 20 uniform eligibility standards for qualified resi-21 dents. 22 (b) REBATE AGREEMENTS WITH MANUFACTUR-23 ERS.— 24 (1) In General.—Under the America Rx pro-

gram the Secretary shall negotiate with manufactur-

- ers of outpatient prescription drugs rebate agree-1 2 ments with respect to drugs offered under the pro-3 gram to qualified residents.
- (2) Minimum amount of rebates.—In nego-5 tiating the amount of such a rebate under paragraph 6 (1), the Secretary shall take into consideration the 7 amount of the rebate calculated under the Medicaid program, the average manufacturer price of pre-8 9 scription drugs, and other information on prescrip-10 tion drug prices and price discounts. The Secretary shall negotiate the amount of such rebates in a man-12 ner so that the rebates on average are comparable 13 to the average percentage rebate obtained in out-14 patient prescription drugs provided under section 15 1927(c) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 16 1396r-8(c)).
 - (3) DISCOUNTED PRICES.—The Secretary shall specify the method for computing and applying such discounts, including a method for computing and applying discounts on a uniform, average percentage basis.
 - (4) Payment.—Rebates under such agreements shall be payable to the Secretary according to a schedule (not less often than quarterly) negotiated with manufacturers and shall be paid, directly or

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- through States, to participating pharmacies that provide discounts to qualified residents.
 - (5) INCENTIVE.—In order to induce manufacturers of outpatient prescription drugs to enter into such rebate agreements to carry out the purpose described in section 1(b), the Secretary shall provide, in the case of a manufacturer that has not entered into such an agreement, for a denial of a deduction under chapter 1 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 for the amount of expenses of the manufacturer for advertising and marketing of drugs of the manufacturer, other than expenses for free samples of drugs subject to section 503(b)(1) of the Federal Food Drug, and Cosmetic Act intended to be distributed to patients.
 - (6) APPLICATION OF REBATES.—Amounts received by the Secretary as rebates under this subsection shall be placed into an appropriate account in the Treasury and shall be available in advance of appropriations to the Secretary for the payment of discounts and other costs of participating pharmacies in carrying out the America Rx program and for the payment of administrative costs in carrying out the program. Under the America Rx program, participating pharmacies shall be ensured reasonable

1	and timely payment of discounts they provide to
2	qualified residents under the program.
3	(c) Role of States in Administering Pro-
4	GRAM.—
5	(1) In general.—Under the America Rx pro-
6	gram the Secretary may enter into appropriate ar-
7	rangements with States under which States provide
8	for the administration of the program in return for
9	payment of the reasonable administrative expenses
10	associated with such administration.
11	(2) Administrative functions.—Such ad-
12	ministration functions may include—
13	(A) determinations of eligibility of qualified
14	residents;
15	(B) arrangements with participating phar-
16	macies; and
17	(C) such other functions as the Secretary
18	determines appropriate.
19	(3) Contractual authority.—In carrying
20	out responsibilities under this section, the Secretary
21	and States may enter into agreements with phar-
22	macy benefit managers and other third parties.
23	(d) Program Eligibility.—

1	(1) Qualified resident defined.—For pur-
2	poses of this section, the term "qualified resident"
3	means an individual who—
4	(A) is a citizen or national of the United
5	States or is lawfully present in the United
6	States (as determined in accordance with sec-
7	tion 1411 of the Patient Protection and Afford-
8	able Care Act); and
9	(B) as determined under regulations of the
10	Secretary, is not covered under any public or
11	private program that provides substantial bene-
12	fits (which may be discounted prices) towards
13	the purchase of outpatient prescription drugs.
14	(2) Screening.—
15	(A) FOR OTHER GOVERNMENTAL PRO-
16	GRAMS.—Individuals who apply for benefits
17	under the America Rx program shall be
18	screened for eligibility under the Medicaid pro-
19	gram and other applicable Governmental health
20	care programs and, if found eligible, shall be
21	enrolled in such program or programs.
22	(B) Screening by Health insurance
23	EXCHANGES.—In the case of individuals enroll-
24	ing in a qualified health plan through a Health

Insurance Exchange under title I of the Patient

- Protection and Affordable Care Act, the Exchange shall provide (at the time of enrollment)
 for a screening of the individual to determine if
 the individual is a qualified resident for purposes of the America Rx program.
 - (3) Relation to other coverage.—In order not to discourage employers and health insurance issuers from providing comprehensive prescription drug coverage through a group health plan or health insurance coverage, no such employer or issuer may participate in a Health Insurance Exchange if the Secretary determines that the prescription drug benefits under the plan or coverage have been reduced as a result of the America Rx program.
 - (4) Protection of the Low income.—Nothing in this section shall be construed as reducing the prescription drug benefits available to low-income individuals, as well as senior citizens and the disabled, under the Medicare or Medicaid programs as a result of the implementation of the America Rx program.
- 22 (e) Arrangements With Participating Phar-23 macies.—
- 24 (1) IN GENERAL.—Under the America Rx pro-25 gram arrangements are made with pharmacies for

1	the provision of prescription drugs at discounted
2	prices to qualified residents in a reasonably acces-
3	sible manner. Such arrangements shall provide
4	that—
5	(A) each participating pharmacy shall—
6	(i) provide discounts on prices for out-
7	patient prescription drugs for qualified
8	residents in return for prompt reimburse-
9	ment of the amount of such discounts and
10	a reasonable dispensing fee;
11	(ii) not charge qualified residents
12	more (before such discounts) for outpatient
13	prescription drugs than the amount that
14	individuals who are not qualified residents
15	are charged for such drugs; and
16	(iii) report to the Secretary (or the
17	Secretary's designee) information regard-
18	ing the discounts provided and fees in-
19	curred; and
20	(B) the program shall—
21	(i) ensure the reasonable and timely
22	payment to a participating retail pharmacy
23	on a prompt basis (no less promptly than
24	as provided under the Medicare program)
25	for discounted prices provided to qualified

1	residents under the program and for rea-
2	sonable dispensing fees; and
3	(ii) not impose any additional fees on
4	such pharmacies in connection with partici-
5	pation in the program.
6	(2) DISCOUNTED PRICES.—The amount of the
7	discount provided to enrolled qualifying residents
8	shall reflect the amount of rebates obtained, reduced
9	by expenses relating to administrative costs of the
10	Federal and State governments and of participating
11	pharmacies.
12	(f) Definitions.—For purposes of this section:
13	(1) The term "Health Insurance Exchange"
14	means such an Exchange as established and oper-
15	ated under part 3 of subtitle D of title I of the Pa-
16	tient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
17	(2) The term "manufacturer" has the meaning
18	given such term in section 1927(k)(5) of the Social
19	Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396r-8(k)(5)).
20	(3) The term "Medicaid program" means a
21	State program under title XIX of the Social Security
22	Act, including such a program operating under a
23	Statewide waiver under section 1115 of such Act.
24	(4) The term "outpatient prescription drug"
25	has the meaning given the term "covered outpatient

- drug" in section 1927(k)(2) of the Social Security
 Act (42 U.S.C. 1396r-8(k)(2)).
 (5) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary
 of Health and Human Services.
 - (6) The term "State" has the meaning given such term for purposes of title XIX of the Social Security Act.

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
