1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Share the Financial3 Burden Act".

4 SEC. 2. CAP ON AMOUNTS PROVIDED FOR ALLOWANCES
5 AND EXPENSES OF HOUSE AND SENATE OF6 FICES.

7 (a) CAP ON ALLOWANCES AND EXPENSES.—The ag-8 gregate amount which may be appropriated or otherwise 9 made available for any fiscal year for allowances and expenses (including salaries) of any office of the House of 10 11 Representatives or any office of the Senate may not exceed 12 95 percent of the aggregate amount appropriated or other-13 wise made available for fiscal year 2010 for allowances and expenses of such office. 14

15 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

16 (1) the term "office of the House of Represent17 atives" means any office for which the amounts pro18 vided for salaries and expenses are disbursed by the
19 Chief Administrative Officer of the House of Rep20 resentatives; and

(2) the term "office of the Senate" means any
office for which the amounts provided for salaries
and expenses are disbursed by the Secretary of the
Senate.

25 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply with
26 respect to fiscal year 2011 and each succeeding fiscal year.
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1 SEC. 3. REDUCTION IN PAY FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

2 (a) REDUCTION.—Section 601(a) of the Legislative
3 Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31) is amended to
4 read as follows:

5 "SEC. 601. Until otherwise provided by the enact6 ment of a bill or joint resolution under section 225 of the
7 Federal Salary Act of 1967 (2 U.S.C. 351 et seq.) or the
8 enactment of any other provision of law, the annual rate
9 of pay for—

"(1) each Senator, Member of the House of
Representatives, and Delegate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress;

"(2) the President pro tempore of the Senate,
the majority leader and the minority leader of the
Senate, and the majority leader and the minority
leader of the House of Representatives; and

17 "(3) the Speaker of the House of Representa-18 tives,

19 shall be 95 percent of the rate payable for such position20 as of the last day of fiscal year 2010.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
subsection (a) shall apply with respect to pay periods beginning on or after January 1, 2011.

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
