AN ACT

To establish the Organized Retail Theft Investigation and Prosecution Unit in the Department of Justice, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act	may be	cited as	s the '	'Organized	Retail	Theft

- 3 Investigation and Prosecution Act of 2010".
- 4 SEC. 2. ORGANIZED RETAIL THEFT INVESTIGATION AND
- 5 PROSECUTION UNIT.
- 6 (a) Establishment.—Not later than 180 days after
- 7 the date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General
- 8 shall establish the Organized Retail Theft Investigation
- 9 and Prosecution Unit (hereinafter in this Act referred to
- 10 as the "ORTIP Unit").
- 11 (b) Composition.—The ORTIP Unit shall include
- 12 representatives from the Federal Bureau of Investigation,
- 13 United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement,
- 14 the United States Secret Service, the United States Postal
- 15 Inspection Service, prosecutors, and any other personnel
- 16 necessary to carry out the duties of the ORTIP Unit.
- 17 (c) DUTIES.—The duties of the ORTIP Unit are as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (1) To investigate and prosecute those instances
- of organized retail theft over which the Department
- of Justice has jurisdiction.
- 22 (2) To assist State and local law enforcement
- agencies in investigating and prosecuting organized
- retail theft.
- 25 (3) To consult with key stakeholders, including
- retailers and online marketplaces, to obtain informa-

- 1 tion about instances of and trends in organized re-
- 2 tail theft.
- 3 SEC. 3. DEFINITION.
- 4 In this Act, the term "organized retail theft"
- 5 means—
- 6 (1) the obtaining of retail merchandise by ille-
- 7 gal means for the purpose of reselling or otherwise
- 8 placing such merchandise back into the stream of
- 9 commerce; or
- 10 (2) aiding or abetting the commission of or con-
- spiring to commit any of the acts described in para-
- 12 graph (1).
- 13 **SEC. 4. REPORT.**
- Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment
- 15 of this Act, the Attorney General shall submit a report
- 16 containing recommendations on how retailers, online busi-
- 17 nesses, and law enforcement agencies can help prevent and
- 18 combat organized retail theft to the Chairs and Ranking
- 19 Members of the Committee on the Judiciary of the House
- 20 of Representatives and of the Committee on the Judiciary
- 21 of the Senate. The Attorney General shall make the report
- 22 available to the public on the web site of the Department
- 23 of Justice.

1 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 2 There are authorized to be appropriated to the Attor-
- 3 ney General to carry out this Act, \$5,000,000 for each
- 4 of fiscal years 2011 through 2015.
