## A BILL

To provide for temporary alternative State "on" and "off" indicators under the Federal-State Extended Unemployment Compensation Act of 1970, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. TEMPORARY SPECIAL RULES.
- 4 Effective with respect to any weeks that begin during
- 5 the period beginning on August 1, 2010, and ending on
- 6 September 30, 2011, a State may by law provide that sec-
- 7 tion 203 of the Federal-State Extended Unemployment
- 8 Compensation Act of 1970 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note) be ap-
- 9 plied as if—

1	(1) subsection (b)(1)(B) of such section had
2	been amended by substituting "first" for "four-
3	teenth''; and
4	(2) subsection (f) of such section had been
5	amended—
6	(A) by substituting "6 percent" for "6.5
7	percent"; and
8	(B) by repealing clause (ii) of paragraph
9	(1)(A) thereof.
10	SEC. 2. CERTIFICATIONS NOT AFFECTED.
11	The Secretary of Labor may not, in the case of any
12	State that amends its State law in conformance with sec-
13	tion 1, withhold certification of such State under section
14	3304 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 if, with re-
15	spect to the period of time to which such certification re-
16	lates, the Secretary of Labor finds that the State law of
17	such State would (disregarding any provisions of such
18	State law as in effect or applied in conformance with sec-
19	tion 1) otherwise satisfy the requirements for certification.
20	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
21	For purposes of this Act, the terms "State", "State
22	law", and "week" have the respective meanings given such
23	terms by section 205 of the Federal-State Extended Un-
24	employment Compensation Act of 1970.
