A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

15 under section 601(a)(2) of the Legislative Reorganization

19 SECTION 2. MANDATORY UNPAID LEAVE.

20 (a) PROVISIONS RELATING TO EMPLOYEES IN THE21 EXECUTIVE BRANCH.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The President shall by regulation provide that, during fiscal year 2011, employees in the executive branch of the Government shall
be subject to—

1	(A) a total of 2 weeks of mandatory un-
2	paid leave; or
3	(B) the pro rata equivalent, in the case of
4	employees serving for less than the entire fiscal
5	year.
6	(2) EXCEPTIONS.—The regulations under para-
7	graph (1) may provide for such exceptions as may
8	be necessary—
9	(A) for reasons of national security;
10	(B) for reasons relating to the public
11	health or safety, including effective law enforce-
12	ment; or
13	(C) for such other reasons as the President
14	considers necessary or appropriate.
15	(b) Provisions Relating to Employees in the
16	JUDICIAL BRANCH.—The Director of the Administrative
17	Office of the United States Courts shall, by regulation,
18	apply this section to employees in the judicial branch of
19	the Government.
20	(c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
21	tion shall be considered to require that mandatory unpaid
22	leave be taken over a continuous period.
23	(d) Employee Defined.—For purposes of this sec-
24	tion, the term "employee" has the meaning given such
25	term by section 2105 of title 5, United States Code.

3 (a) REDUCTION.—The aggregate amount which may
4 be appropriated or otherwise made available for any fiscal
5 year for allowances and expenses (including salaries) of
6 any office of the legislative branch may not exceed 96%
7 of the aggregate amount appropriated or otherwise made
8 available for fiscal year 2010 for allowances and expenses
9 of such office.

(b) EXCEPTION FOR CAPITOL POLICE.—Subsection
(a) does not apply with respect to the United States Capitol Police.

13 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply with14 respect to fiscal year 2011 and each succeeding fiscal year.
