Mr. Brady of Pennsylvania (for himself, Mr. Fattah, Ms. Schwartz, and Mr. Patrick J. Murphy of Pennsylvania) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To charter an organization and establish a medal program to honor first responders in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF ORGANIZATION.
- 4 (a) Organization.—The Medal of Courage and
- 5 Service Corporation, located in Philadelphia, Pennsyl-
- 6 vania, is a federally chartered organization.
- 7 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of the Corporation is to
- 8 honor first responders in the city of Philadelphia by, act-
- 9 ing through the Selection Committee convened under sub-

1	section (c)(2), awarding the Medal of Courage and Service
2	to first responders in that city.
3	(c) Functions.—
4	(1) In general.—The Corporation shall act as
5	the administrator of the Medal program under sec-
6	tion 2.
7	(2) Selection committee.—The Corporation
8	shall convene a Selection Committee to select first
9	responders to receive the Medal, to be organized as
10	follows:
11	(A) The Selection Committee shall be com-
12	posed of—
13	(i) the Police Commissioner of Phila-
14	delphia;
15	(ii) the Fire Commissioner of Phila-
16	delphia;
17	(iii) the president of the Philadelphia
18	Fire Fighters' Union Local #22;
19	(iv) the president of the Philadelphia
20	Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #5; and
21	(v) 4 civilian representatives, one ap-
22	pointed by each of the members described
23	in clauses (i) through (iv).
24	(B) The chairmanship of the Selection
25	Committee shall alternate annually between the

- 1 member described in subparagraph (A)(i) and
- the member described in subparagraph (A)(ii).
- 3 (d) Annual Report.—The Corporation shall submit
- 4 to Congress an annual report on its activities under this
- 5 Act.

6 SEC. 2. MEDAL PROGRAM.

- 7 (a) Authorization of Medal.—The Corporation
- 8 may award, and present in the name of Congress, a Medal
- 9 of Courage and Service of appropriate design to a first
- 10 responder who is selected by the Selection Committee.
- 11 (b) Duties of Selection Committee.—The Selec-
- 12 tion Committee shall—
- 13 (1) establish criteria for awarding the Medal;
- 14 (2) accept nominations of first responders from
- the Police and Fire Departments of Philadelphia
- each calendar year; and
- 17 (3) select no more than 3 first responders per
- 18 year to receive a Medal, except that in any year in
- which the Selection Committee determines, by unan-
- 20 imous consent, that extraordinary or extenuating cir-
- 21 cumstances exist regarding an incident, the Selection
- Committee may select more than 3 first responders
- to receive a Medal.
- 24 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
- 25 In this Act:

- (1) CORPORATION.—The term "Corporation" means the Medal of Courage and Service Corporation chartered in section 1(a).
 - (2) FIRST RESPONDER.—The term "first responder" means an individual who, in the early stages of an incident, is responsible for the protection and preservation of life, property, evidence, and the environment, including emergency response providers as defined in section 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101), as well as emergency management, public health, clinical care, public works, and other skilled support personnel (such as equipment operators) that provide immediate support services during prevention, response, and recovery operations.
 - (3) MEDAL.—The term "Medal" means the Medal of Courage and Service authorized under section 2(a).
 - (4) SELECTION COMMITTEE.—The term "Selection Committee" means the Medal of Courage and Service Selection Committee convened under section 1(c)(2).
