A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to exempt certain emergency medical devices from the excise tax on medical devices.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPEALING FIRST RESPONDERS EMERGENCY**
4 **MEDICAL EQUIPMENT TAX.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 4191(b)
6 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by strik-
7 ing “and” at the end of subparagraph (C), by redesignig-
8 nating subparagraph (D) as subparagraph (E), and by in-
9 serting after subparagraph (C) the following new subpara-
10 graph:

1 “(D) qualified emergency medical devices,
2 and”.

3 (b) QUALIFIED EMERGENCY MEDICAL DEVICE.—

4 Subsection (b) of section 4191 of such Code is amended
5 by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

6 “(3) QUALIFIED EMERGENCY MEDICAL DE-
7 VICE.—The term ‘qualified emergency medical de-
8 vice’ means any medical device of a type furnished
9 by first responders or ambulance services in pro-
10 viding out-of-hospital or pre-hospital care, or trans-
11 port to a medical care facility, for individuals—

12 “(A) with illnesses, injuries, or other med-
13 ical emergencies, or

14 “(B) in need of medical transport, extri-
15 cation, or evacuation.”.

16 (c) CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS MADE APPLICABLE.—

17 (1) The last sentence of subsection (a) of sec-
18 tion 4221 of such Code is amended by striking
19 “(4),”.

20 (2) The last sentence of paragraph (2) of sec-
21 tion 6416(b) of such Code is amended by striking
22 “(C),”.

23 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
24 this section shall apply to sales after December 31, 2012.

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
