## A BILL

To require reports on the management of Arlington National Cemetery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. REPORTS ON MANAGEMENT OF ARLINGTON
 NATIONAL CEMETERY.

(a) REPORT ON GRAVESITE DISCREPANCIES.—Not
later than one year after the date of the enactment of this
Act, the Secretary of the Army shall submit to the committees of Congress specified in subsection (c) a report
setting forth an accounting of the gravesites at Arlington
National Cemetery, Virginia. The accounting shall—

8	(C) An assessment of the management and
9	oversight by the Executive Director of the Army

13	pose by the Corps of Engineers and the Na-
14	tional Capital Region Contracting Center of the
15	Army Contracting Command.
16	(D) An assessment of the actions taken by
17	the Executive Director of the Army National
18	Cemeteries Program in response to the findings
19	and recommendations of the Inspector General
20	of the Army in the report entitled "Report of
21	Investigation and Special Inspection of Arling-
22	ton National Cemetery Final Report (Case 10–

23 04)", dated June 9, 2010.

24 (E) An assessment of the implementation25 of the following:

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1	(i) Army Directive 2010–04 on En-

12	studies, evaluations, and requirements
13	specified in the Army Directive.
14	(ii) The recommendations and actions

16	Advisory Commission with respect to Ar-
17	lington National Cemetery.
18	(F) An assessment of the adequacy of cur-
19	rent practices at Arlington National Cemetery
20	to provide information, outreach, and support
21	to families of individuals buried at Arlington
22	National Cemetery regarding procedures to de-

1 (G) An assessment of the feasibility and 2 advisability of transferring jurisdiction of Arlington National Cemetery and the United 3 4 States Soldiers' and Airmen's Home National Cemetery to the Department of Veterans Af-5 6 fairs, and an assessment of the feasibility and 7 advisability of the sharing of jurisdiction of 8 such facilities between the Department of De-9 fense and the Department of Veterans Affairs. 10 (3) SIMPLIFIED ACQUISITION THRESHOLD DE-11 FINED.—In this subsection, the term "simplified ac-12 quisition threshold" has the meaning provided that 13 term in section 4 of the Office of Federal Procure-14 ment Policy Act (41 U.S.C. 403).

15 (c) SPECIFIED COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS.—The
16 committees of Congress specified in this subsection are—

17 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
18 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
19 Affairs, and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
20 the Senate; and

(2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
Committee on Oversight and Government Reform,
and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
House of Representatives.

(d) REPORTS ON IMPLEMENTATION OF ARMY DIREC TIVE ON ARMY NATIONAL CEMETERIES PROGRAM.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Army 4 shall submit to the appropriate committees of Con-5 gress reports on execution of and compliance with 6 Army Directive 2010–04 on Enhancing the Oper-7 ations and Oversight of the Army National Ceme-8 teries Program, dated June 10, 2010. Each such re-9 port shall include, for the preceding 270 days or year (as applicable), a description and assessment of 10 11 the following:

12 (A) Execution of and compliance with 13 every section of the Army Directive for Arling-14 ton National Cemetery, including, without limi-15 tation, an evaluation of the sufficiency of all 16 contract management and oversight procedures, 17 current and planned information and tech-18 nology systems, applications, and contracts, 19 current organizational structure and manpower, 20 and compliance with and execution of all plans, 21 reviews, studies, evaluations, and requirements 22 specified in the Army Directive.

(B) The adequacy of current practices at
Arlington National Cemetery to provide information, outreach, and support to families of

those individuals buried at Arlington National
 Cemetery regarding procedures to detect and
 correct current errors in burials at Arlington
 National Cemetery.

5 (2) PERIOD AND FREQUENCY OF SUBMITTAL.—
6 A report required by paragraph (1) shall be sub7 mitted not later than 270 days after the date of the
8 enactment of this Act, and every year thereafter for
9 the next 2 years.

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
