## A BILL

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Safe Schools, Healthy5 Kids Act of 2010".

# 1SEC. 2. GRANTS FOR ABATEMENT, REMOVAL, AND INTERIM2CONTROLSOF3BIPHENYLS IN PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITIES.

4 (a) GRANTS AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of Edu-5 cation is authorized to make grants to States and local 6 educational agencies for abatement, removal, and interim 7 controls of polychlorinated biphenyls in public school fa-8 cilities, including, where applicable, early learning facili-9 ties.

(b) APPLICATION.—To be eligible to receive a grant
under subsection (a), a State or local educational agency
shall submit to the Secretary an application at such time,
in such manner, and containing such information as the
Secretary may require.

15 (c) COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION.—A State or local 16 educational agency receiving a grant under subsection (a) 17 shall be required to provide notification to the students 18 and their families, staff and school employees, and other 19 relevant parties in the community of the work to be under-20 taken with the grant. The notification shall contain such 21 additional information as the Secretary shall require.

(d) COORDINATION WITH ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY.—The Administrator of the United States
Environmental Protection Agency shall provide to the Secretary of Education such guidance as may be necessary,
including promulgating necessary regulations, to ensure
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safe school conditions and effective abatement, removal, 1 2 or interim controls. Such guidance may be used by— 3 (1) the Secretary in defining application and selection criteria; 4 5 (2) State or local educational agencies in developing work plans and applications for grants under 6 7 subsection (a); and (3) State or local educational agencies in car-8 rying out the work after receiving a grant under 9 10 subsection (a). 11 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 12 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this Act \$150,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2011 through 2015.

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
