AN ACT

- To require the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study regarding the proposed United States Civil Rights Trail, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "United States Civil
 - 5 Rights Trail Special Resource Study Act of 2009".

SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY REGARDING PROPOSED UNITED STATES CIVIL RIGHTS TRAIL.

3 (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Secretary of the Inte-4 rior shall conduct a special resource study for the purpose 5 of evaluating a range of alternatives for protecting and 6 interpreting sites associated with the struggle for civil 7 rights in the United States, including alternatives for po-8 tential addition of some or all of the sites to the National 9 Trails System.

10 (b) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary shall conduct
11 the special resource study in consultation with appropriate
12 Federal, State, county, and local governmental entities.

(c) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study required under subsection (a) in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C.
1a–5(c)) and section 5(b) of the National Trails System
Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)), as appropriate.

18 (d) STUDY OBJECTIVES.—In conducting the special
19 resource study, the Secretary shall evaluate alternatives
20 for achieving the following objectives:

(1) Identifying the resources and historic
themes associated with the movement to secure racial equality in the United States for African Americans that, focusing on the period from 1954 through
1968, challenged the practice of racial segregation in

the Nation and achieved equal rights for all Amer ican citizens.

3 (2) Making a review of existing studies and re4 ports, such as the Civil Rights Framework Study, to
5 complement and not duplicate other studies of the
6 historical importance of the civil rights movements
7 that may be underway or undertaken.

8 (3) Establishing connections with agencies, or-9 ganizations, and partnerships already engaged in the 10 preservation and interpretation of various trails and 11 sites dealing with the civil rights movement.

12 (4) Protecting historically significant land-13 scapes, districts, sites, and structures.

14 (5) Identifying alternatives for preservation and
15 interpretation of the sites by the National Park
16 Service, other Federal, State, or local governmental
17 entities, or private and nonprofit organizations, in18 cluding the potential inclusion of some or all of the
19 sites in a National Civil Rights Trail.

20 (6) Identifying cost estimates for any necessary
21 acquisition, development, interpretation, operation,
22 and maintenance associated with the alternatives de23 veloped under the special resource study.

(e) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the dateon which funds are made available to carry out this sec-

tion, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Nat ural Resources of the House of Representatives and the
 Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen ate a report containing the results of the study conducted
 under subsection (c) and any recommendations of the Sec retary with respect to the route.

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
