## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to conduct a program in the maritime environment for the mobile biometric identification of suspected individuals, including terrorists, to enhance border security.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MARITIME BIOMETRIC IDENTIFICATION.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the
- 5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Home-
- 6 land Security, acting through the Commandant of the
- 7 Coast Guard, shall conduct, in the maritime environment,

- 1 a program for the mobile biometric identification of sus-
- 2 pected individuals, including terrorists, to enhance border
- 3 security and for other purposes.
- 4 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall ensure the
- 5 program described in subsection (a) is coordinated with
- 6 other biometric identification programs within the Depart-
- 7 ment of Homeland Security.
- 8 (c) Cost Analysis.—Not later than 90 days after
- 9 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
- 10 submit to the Committees on Appropriations and Home-
- 11 land Security of the House of Representatives and the
- 12 Committees on Appropriations and Homeland Security
- 13 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate an analysis of the
- 14 cost of expanding the Coast Guard's biometric identifica-
- 15 tion capabilities for use by the Coast Guard's Deployable
- 16 Operations Group, cutters, stations, and other deployable
- 17 maritime teams considered appropriate by the Secretary,
- 18 and any other appropriate Department of Homeland Secu-
- 19 rity maritime vessels and units. The analysis may include
- 20 a tiered plan for the deployment of the program described
- 21 in subsection (a) that gives priority to vessels and units
- 22 more likely to encounter individuals suspected of making
- 23 unlawful border crossings through the maritime environ-
- 24 ment.

- 1 (d) Definition.—For the purposes of this section,
- 2 the term "biometric identification" means the use of fin-

3 gerprint and digital photography images.
