# A BILL

To provide for an awareness program, and a study, on a rare form of breast cancer.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  4 This Act may be cited as the "Paget's Cancer Aware5 ness Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds as follows:
- 8 (1) Paget's disease of the breast is a rare can-
- 9 cer of the nipple, accounting for a small fraction of
- all breast cancers. The cancer is a different disease

- than any other, not to be confused with Paget's disease, a devastating bone disease.
  - (2) In Paget's disease of the breast, the abnormal cells begin growing in the milk ducts of the nipple and can develop into a tumor.
- 6 (3) The cancer usually appears in women, but 7 can also affect males.
- (4) It is a slow growing cancer, and with propertreatment can be cured.
- 10 (5) The symptoms of the cancer appear to be
  11 harmless. The symptoms in the nipple closely resem12 ble a skin inflammation (dermatitis) or infection.
  13 This can lead to unfortunate delays in detection and
  14 care.
  - (6) By the time the cancer is diagnosed, many patients have a palpable mass. The underlying cancer may be invasive or in situ.
- 18 (7) Standard treatment is identical to that for 19 other forms of breast cancer, and the prognosis de-20 pends on the invasiveness and size of the tumor and 21 the presence or absence of lymph node involvement.

#### 22 SEC. 3. PROGRAMS REGARDING PAGET'S CANCER.

23 (a) AWARENESS PROGRAM.—The Secretary of 24 Health and Human Services (in this section referred to 25 as the "Secretary") shall carry out a program to provide

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- 1 information and education to health professionals and the
- 2 general public on the symptoms of and treatment for
- 3 Paget's disease of the breast.
- 4 (b) Study.—

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- 5 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall conduct 6 a study for the purpose of carrying out the following 7 with respect to Paget's disease of the breast:
  - (A) Collecting data to identify the full range of symptoms associated with the disease, and to identify the average time elapsing between the onset of symptoms and the diagnosis and treatment of the disease.
  - (B) Collecting demographic data regarding the disease, including data specific to the prevalence of the disease in demographic populations according to race, ethnicity, gender, age, and geographic region of residence.
  - (2) Report.—Not later than 24 months after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall complete the study under paragraph (1) and submit to the Congress a report describing the findings made in the study.
- 23 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the 24 purpose of carrying out this section, there are authorized

- 1 to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for
- $2\,\,$  each of the fiscal years 2010 through 2012.

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
