Mr. FLAKE submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the
Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Establishing an earmark moratorium for fiscal year 2011.

1 *Resolved*, That (a) it shall not be in order to con-
2 sider—

3 (1) a bill or joint resolution reported by any
4 committee, or any amendment thereto or conference
5 report thereon, that includes a congressional ear-
6 mark, limited tax benefit, or limited tariff benefit; or

7 (2) a bill or joint resolution not reported by any
8 committee, or any amendment thereto or conference
9 report thereon, that includes a congressional ear-
10 mark, limited tax benefit, or limited tariff benefit.

11 (b) For the purposes of this resolution, the terms
12 “congressional earmark”, “limited tax benefit”, and “lim-

1 ited tariff benefit” have the meaning given those terms
2 in clause 9 of rule XXI of the Rules of the House of Rep-
3 resentatives.

4 (c) The point of order under subsection (a) shall only
5 apply to legislation providing or authorizing discretionary
6 budget authority, credit authority, or other spending au-
7 thority, providing a Federal tax deduction, credit, or exclu-
8 sion, or modifying the Harmonized Tariff Schedule in fis-
9 cal year 2011.

10 (d) This resolution shall not apply to any authoriza-
11 tion of appropriations to a Federal entity if such author-
12 ization is not specifically targeted to a State, locality, or
13 congressional district.

14 SEC. 2. The Committee on Rules may not report a
15 rule or order that would waive the point of order set forth
16 in the first section of this resolution.
