RESOLUTION

Establishing an earmark moratorium for fiscal year 2011.

Resolved, That (a) it shall not be in order to con sider—

3 (1) a bill or joint resolution reported by any
4 committee, or any amendment thereto or conference
5 report thereon, that includes a congressional ear6 mark, limited tax benefit, or limited tariff benefit; or

7 (2) a bill or joint resolution not reported by any
8 committee, or any amendment thereto or conference
9 report thereon, that includes a congressional ear10 mark, limited tax benefit, or limited tariff benefit.

(b) For the purposes of this resolution, the terms"congressional earmark", "limited tax benefit", and "lim-

ited tariff benefit" have the meaning given those terms
 in clause 9 of rule XXI of the Rules of the House of Rep resentatives.

4 (c) The point of order under subsection (a) shall only
5 apply to legislation providing or authorizing discretionary
6 budget authority, credit authority, or other spending au7 thority, providing a Federal tax deduction, credit, or exclu8 sion, or modifying the Harmonized Tariff Schedule in fis9 cal year 2011.

(d) This resolution shall not apply to any authorization of appropriations to a Federal entity if such authorization is not specifically targeted to a State, locality, or
congressional district.

SEC. 2. The Committee on Rules may not report arule or order that would waive the point of order set forthin the first section of this resolution.
