Mr. HASTINGS of Washington (for himself and Mr. BISHOP of Utah) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

RESOLUTION

Directing the Secretary of the Interior to transmit to the House of Representatives certain information relating to the Secretary's Treasured Landscape Initiative, designation of National Monuments, and high priority land-rationalization efforts.

1 *Resolved*, That the Secretary of Interior is directed
2 to transmit to the House of Representatives, not later
3 than 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolu-
4 tion, copies of all Department of the Interior documents,
5 maps, records (including electronic records), communica-
6 tions and other information from July 1, 2009, and later
7 referring to or relating to—

1 (1) potential National Monument designations
2 under the Antiquities Act;

3 (2) the document containing “Attachment 4
4 Prospective Conservation Designation: National
5 Monument Designations under the Antiquities Act”
6 and marked “Internal Draft—NOT FOR RE-
7 LEASE”, including that document in full, all at-
8 tachments in full, and all iterations of that docu-
9 ment, and related similar documents;

10 (3) any “brainstorming” sessions relating to the
11 Secretary’s Treasured Landscape Initiative, designa-
12 tion of National Monuments, and high priority land-
13 rationalization efforts, including any documents pre-
14 pared for or distributed at the sessions, a list of all
15 participants, attendees, and invitees, notes taken at
16 the sessions, and any memoranda, work products,
17 and follow-up documents produced as a result of the
18 sessions; and

19 (4) any other meetings, communications, or dis-
20 cussions with private groups, individuals, or entities
21 who are not employees of the Department of the In-
22 terior where the Secretary’s Treasured Landscape
23 Initiative, designation of National Monuments, and
24 high priority land-rationalization efforts were dis-

- 1 cussed, including all notes, agendas, and memo-
- 2 randa.
