## RESOLUTION

Establishing an earmark moratorium for fiscal year 2011.

1 Resolved, That (a) it shall not be in order to con-2 sider— 3 (1) a bill or joint resolution reported by any committee, or any amendment thereto or conference 5 report thereon, that includes a congressional ear-6 mark or limited tax benefit; or 7 (2) a bill or joint resolution not reported by any 8 committee, or any amendment thereto or conference 9 report thereon, that includes a congressional earmark or limited tax benefit. 10 11 (b) For the purposes of this resolution, the terms

"congressional earmark" and "limited tax benefit" have

- 1 the meaning given those terms in clause 9 of rule XXI
- 2 of the Rules of the House of Representatives.
- 3 (c) The point of order under subsection (a) shall only
- 4 apply to legislation providing or authorizing discretionary
- 5 budget authority, credit authority, or other spending au-
- 6 thority, or providing a Federal tax deduction, credit, or
- 7 exclusion in fiscal year 2011.
- 8 (d) This resolution shall not apply to any authoriza-
- 9 tion of appropriations to a Federal entity if such author-
- 10 ization is not specifically targeted to a State, locality, or
- 11 congressional district.
- 12 Sec. 2. The Committee on Rules may not report a
- 13 rule or order that would waive the point of order set forth
- 14 in the first section of this resolution.

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
