RESOLUTION

- Honoring the Armed Forces from the Inland Empire in California and their families for their extraordinary sacrifices serving the United States in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.
- Whereas the Armed Forces includes all branches of the military, including the National Guard and Reserves;
- Whereas more than 1,811,843 members of the Armed Forces have been deployed in Operation Enduring Freedom or Operation Iraqi Freedom since September 2001;
- Whereas over 512 Californians have died in Afghanistan and Iraq, many of whom were from the communities of the Inland Empire;

- Whereas over 3,477 Californians have been wounded in battle in Afghanistan and Iraq, many of whom are from the communities of the Inland Empire;
- Whereas both physical and mental injuries sustained during combat have a life-altering impact on those who served our Nation, as well as their families;
- Whereas members of the Armed Forces from the Inland Empire have been killed and injured in operations to bring peace and stability, in the name of democracy;
- Whereas the Inland Empire region of southern California includes the counties of San Bernardino and Riverside, and unincorporated areas of Muscoy and Etiwanda; and
- Whereas members of the Armed Forces from the Inland Empire have served honorably in their mission to fight terrorism and protect the greater security of the United States: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives—
- 2 (1) recognizes that the members of the Armed
- Forces from the Inland Empire gave, and continue
- 4 to give, to our Nation;
- 5 (2) commits to providing wounded warriors
- 6 with the highest quality of medical care available, in-
- 7 cluding for their families during the recovery proc-
- 8 ess;
- 9 (3) commends the actions of private citizens
- and organizations from the Inland Empire who vol-
- 11 unteer to support America's wounded warriors;

1	(4) encourages Members and all citizens to take
2	steps to show support and appreciation for all re-
3	turning troops;

- (5) honors and recognizes the sacrifices made by the members of the Armed Forces from the Inland Empire, and that of their families; and
- (6) understands that the American people are forever grateful to the members of the Armed Forces from the Inland Empire for the service they have provided to the United States.
