A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Army to calculate the aggregate withdrawals of non-Federal entities, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. CALCULATION OF WITHDRAWALS. (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section: 4
- 5 (1) Return flow.—
- (A) IN GENERAL.—The term "return flow" 6 means a discharge that flows directly or indi-7 8

rectly into a reservoir from a wastewater or

1	water supply system in accordance with applica-
2	ble Federal law (including regulations).

- (B) EXCLUSION.—The term "return flow" does not include a discharge of storm water that would have flowed into a reservoir described in subparagraph (A) in the absence of a discharge by a non-Federal entity.
- 8 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
 9 the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief
 10 of Engineers.
- 11 (b) CALCULATION OF RETURN FLOW.—At the re12 quest of a State in which a Federal reservoir operated by
 13 the Secretary is located, the Secretary shall calculate the
 14 aggregate withdrawals of a non-Federal entity by sub15 tracting any return flow from the aggregate withdrawals
 16 of the non-Federal entity.
