## A BILL

- To provide for a land exchange involving certain National Forest System land in the Mendocino National Forest in the State of California, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Deafy Glade Land Ex-
  - 5 change Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. LAND EXCHANGE, MENDOCINO NATIONAL FOREST,
  - 7 CALIFORNIA.
  - 8 (a) Definitions.—In this section:

1	(1) County.—The term "County" means So-
2	lano County, California.
3	(2) FEDERAL LAND.—The term "Federal land"
4	means the parcel of approximately 82 acres of land
5	(including any improvements to the land) that is—
6	(A) in the Forest;
7	(B) known as the "Fouts Springs Ranch";
8	and
9	(C) depicted on the map.
10	(3) Forest.—The term "Forest" means the
11	Mendocino National Forest in the State of Cali-
12	fornia.
13	(4) MAP.—The term "map" means the map en-
14	titled "Fouts Springs-Deafy Glade Federal and Non-
15	Federal Lands" and dated July 17, 2008.
16	(5) Non-federal land.—The term "non-fed-
17	eral land" means the 4 parcels of land comprising
18	approximately 160 acres, as depicted on the map.
19	(6) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
20	the Secretary of Agriculture.
21	(b) LAND EXCHANGE REQUIRED.—If the County
22	conveys to the Secretary all right, title, and interest of
23	the County in and to the non-Federal land, the Secretary
24	shall convey to the County all right, title, and interest of
25	the United States in and to the Federal land.

1	(c) Map.—
2	(1) AVAILABILITY.—The map shall be on file
3	and available for public inspection in the Office of
4	the Chief of the Forest Service.
5	(2) Corrections.—With the agreement of the
6	County, the Secretary may make technical correc-
7	tions to the map and legal descriptions of the land
8	to be exchanged under this section.
9	(d) Applicable Law.—Section 206 of the Federal
10	Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C.
11	1716) shall apply to the land exchange under this section.
12	(e) Survey; Administrative Costs.—
13	(1) IN GENERAL.—The exact acreage and legal
14	description of the land to be exchanged under sub-
15	section (b) shall be determined by a survey satisfac-
16	tory to the Secretary.
17	(2) Costs.—The costs of the survey and any
18	administrative costs relating to the land exchange
19	shall be paid by the County.
20	(f) Condition on Use of Conveyed Land.—As a
21	condition of the conveyance of the Federal land to the
22	County under subsection (b), the County shall agree to
23	continue to use the Federal land for purposes consistent

24 with the purposes described in the special use authoriza-

tion for the Fouts Springs Ranch in effect as of the date of enactment of this Act. 3 (g) Easement Authority.—The Secretary may grant an easement to provide continued access to, and maintenance and use of, the facilities covered by the special use authorization referred to in subsection (f) as nec-6 essary for the continued operation of the Fouts Springs 8 Ranch. 9 (h) Management of Acquired Land.—The non-10 Federal land acquired by the Secretary under subsection 11 (b) shall be— 12 (1) added to, and administered as part of, the 13 Forest; and (2) managed in accordance with— 14 15 (A) the Act of March 1, 1911 (commonly known as the "Weeks Law") (16 U.S.C. 480 et 16 17 seq.); and 18 (B) the laws (including regulations) appli-19 cable to the National Forest System. 20 (i) Additional Terms and Conditions.—The land 21 exchange under subsection (b) shall be subject to any ad-22 ditional terms and conditions that the Secretary and the

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County may agree on.
