A BILL

To amend the National Agricultural Research, Extension, and Teaching Policy Act of 1977 to establish a grant program to promote efforts to develop, implement, and sustain veterinary services, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterinary Services
- 5 Investment Act".

1	SEC. 2. VETERINARY SERVICES AND OUTREACH GRANT
2	PROGRAM.
3	The National Agricultural Research, Extension, and
4	Teaching Policy Act of 1977 is amended by inserting after
5	section 1415A (7 U.S.C. 3151a) the following:
6	"SEC. 1415B. VETERINARY SERVICES AND OUTREACH
7	GRANT PROGRAM.
8	"(a) Definitions.—In this section:
9	"(1) QUALIFIED ENTITY.—The term 'qualified
10	entity' means the following:
11	"(A) A for-profit or nonprofit entity lo-
12	cated in the United States that operates a vet-
13	erinary clinic providing veterinary services—
14	"(i) in a rural area, as defined in sec-
15	tion 1393(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue
16	Code of 1986; or
17	"(ii) in response to a veterinarian
18	shortage situation.
19	"(B) A State, national, allied, or regional
20	veterinary organization or specialty board rec-
21	ognized by the American Veterinary Medical
22	Association.
23	"(C) A college or school of veterinary med-
24	icine accredited by the American Veterinary
25	Medical Association.

1	"(D) A university research foundation or
2	veterinary medical foundation.
3	"(E) A department of veterinary science or
4	department of comparative medicine at an ac-
5	credited institution of higher education recog-
6	nized by the Department of Education.
7	"(F) A State agricultural experiment sta-
8	tion.
9	"(G) A State, local, or tribal government
10	agency.
11	"(2) Veterinarian shortage situation.—
12	The term 'veterinarian shortage situation' means a
13	veterinarian shortage situation determined by the
14	Secretary under section 1415A(b).
15	"(b) Establishment of Program.—
16	"(1) Competitive grants.—The Secretary
17	shall carry out a program to make competitive
18	grants to qualified entities described in paragraph
19	(2) for the purpose of developing, implementing, and
20	sustaining veterinary services.
21	"(2) Eligibility requirements.—To be eligi-
22	ble for a grant under this section, a qualified entity
23	shall carry out programs or activities that the Sec-
24	retary determines will—

1	"(A) substantially relieve veterinary short-
2	age situations;
3	"(B) support or facilitate private veteri-
4	nary practices engaged in public health activi-
5	ties; or
6	"(C) support or facilitate practices of vet-
7	erinarians who are participating in, or have suc-
8	cessfully completed, a service requirement under
9	section 1415A.
10	"(c) Award Processes and Preferences.—
11	"(1) Application, evaluation, and input
12	PROCESSES.—In administering the grant program
13	under this section, the Secretary shall—
14	"(A) use an appropriate application and
15	evaluation process; and
16	"(B) seek the input of interested persons.
17	"(2) Grant preferences.—In selecting quali-
18	fied entities to receive a grant under this section, the
19	Secretary shall give a preference to qualified entities
20	that—
21	"(A) document coordination between or
22	with—
23	"(i) a State, national, allied, or re-
24	gional veterinary organization, a specialty
25	board, or veterinary medical association

1	recognized by the American Veterinary
2	Medical Association;
3	"(ii) the applicable accredited veteri-
4	nary education institution or department
5	of veterinary science or department of
6	comparative medicine at an accredited in-
7	stitution of higher education recognized by
8	the Department of Education; or
9	"(iii) the applicable State veterinarian
10	or animal health official (or equivalent offi-
11	cial); and
12	"(B) will use the grant funds to help to
13	meet veterinary workforce or food protection
14	needs.
15	"(3) Additional preferences.—In awarding
16	grants under this section, the Secretary may develop
17	additional preferences by taking into account—
18	"(A) the amount of funds available for
19	grants; and
20	"(B) the purposes for which the grant
21	funds will be used.
22	"(4) Applicability of other provisions.—
23	Sections $1413B$, $1462(a)$, and subsections $(a)(3)$
24	and (c) of section 1469 shall apply to the adminis-
25	tration of the grant program under this section.

1	"(d) Cost-Sharing Requirements.—
2	"(1) RECIPIENT SHARE.—A grant recipient
3	shall provide matching non-Federal funds, either in
4	the form of cash or in-kind contributions, in an
5	amount equal to not less than 25 percent of the
6	Federal funds provided in a grant under this section.
7	"(2) WAIVER.—The Secretary may establish, by
8	regulation, conditions under which the cost-sharing
9	requirements of paragraph (1) may be reduced or
10	waived.
11	"(e) Use of Grant To Relieve Veterinary
12	SHORTAGE SITUATIONS AND SUPPORT VETERINARY
13	SERVICES.—Funds provided by grants under this section
14	may be used for the following purposes to relieve veteri-
15	nary shortage situations and support veterinary services:
16	"(1) Grants to promote recruitment, placement,
17	and retention of—
18	"(A) veterinarians;
19	"(B) veterinary technicians;
20	"(C) students of veterinary medicine; and
21	"(D) students of veterinary technology.
22	"(2) Grants to assist veterinarians with estab-
23	lishing or expanding practices for the purposes of—
24	"(A) equipping veterinary offices;

1	"(B) sharing in the overhead costs of the
2	practices; or
3	"(C) establishing mobile veterinary facili-
4	ties at which at least a portion of the facilities
5	will address education or extension needs.
6	"(3) Financial assistance for veterinary stu-
7	dents, veterinary interns, externs, fellows, and resi-
8	dents, and veterinary technician students to attend
9	training programs in food safety or food animal
10	medicine to cover expenses other than tuition.
11	"(4) Programs establishing or expanding ac-
12	credited veterinary education programs, veterinary
13	residency and fellowship programs, or veterinary in-
14	ternship and externship programs in coordination
15	with accredited colleges of veterinary medicine.
16	"(5) Programs for tele-veterinary medicine at
17	practices that contribute to veterinary extension,
18	education, or research.
19	"(6) Support the ability of the office or position
20	of a State veterinarian or animal health official to
21	coordinate veterinary services and food protection
22	issues described in paragraphs (1) through (5).
23	"(7) Assessments of veterinarian shortage situ-
24	ations and preparation of applications for designa-
25	tion as a shortage situation.

- "(8) Programs in continuing education and extension (including distance-based education) for veterinarians, veterinary technicians, and other health professionals needed to strengthen veterinary programs and enhance food safety.
- 6 "(9) Faculty recruitment and retention pro-7 grams at accredited colleges of veterinary medicine.
- 8 "(10) Programs, in coordination with univer-9 sities or local educational agencies, to encourage stu-10 dents in secondary schools to pursue a career in vet-11 erinary medicine or science professions.
- 12 "(f) Prohibition on Use of Grant Funds for
- 13 Construction.—Funds made available for grants under
- 14 this section shall not be used for the construction of a
- 15 new building or facility or the acquisition, expansion, re-
- 16 modeling, or alteration of an existing building of facility,
- 17 including site grading and improvement and architect fees.
- 18 "(g) Implementation.—Not later than 1 year after
- 19 the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall
- 20 promulgate regulations to implement the grant program
- 21 authorized under this section.
- 22 "(h) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 23 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary such

- 1 sums as are necessary to carry out this section for fiscal
- $2\;$ year 2011 and each fiscal year thereafter.".
