A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of the General of the Army George Catlett Marshall National Historic Site at Dodona Manor in Leesburg, Virginia, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "George C. Marshall
3	National Historic Site Study Act''.
4	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
5	Congress finds that—
6	(1) General George Catlett Marshall and his
7	wife Katherine owned Dodona Manor during Mar-
8	shall's tenure as—
9	(A) the Army's Chief of Staff from 1939
10	to 1945;
11	(B) the Secretary of State from 1947 to
12	1948; and
13	(C) Secretary of Defense from 1950 to
14	1951;
15	(2) General Marshall served in the Federal
16	Government during a period in which the United
17	States faced the challenges of—
18	(A) fighting and winning a world war; and
19	(B) developing a global recovery plan to
20	defend the free world from the emerging Cold
21	War;
22	(3) Dodona Manor—
23	(A) was built in 3 stages; and
24	(B) has been impeccably restored to mu-
25	seum standards with the original Marshall fur-
26	nishing;

1	(4) the impeccable restoration of Dodona
2	Manor preserves the integrity of the homelife of
3	General Marshall so that Dodona Manor accurately
4	presents a picture of an American hero to present
5	and future generations;
6	(5) during his time at Dodona Manor, General
7	Marshall was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for
8	leadership and actions that have relevance in the
9	current troubling times; and
10	(6) Dodona Manor—
11	(A) displays in a pastoral and educational
12	format how the Marshall family solely dedicated
13	themselves to public service while living in har-
14	mony with the heritage of Virginia; and
15	(B) shows how Marshall embraced his per-
16	sonal passion of gardening in a way that would
17	inspire visitors.
18	SEC. 3. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
19	(a) Study.—The Secretary of the Interior (referred
20	to in this Act as the "Secretary") shall conduct a special
21	resource study of the Dodona Manor and gardens in Lees-
22	burg, Virginia, the home of George C. Marshall during the
23	most important period of Marshall's career (referred to
24	in this Act as the "study area").

1	(b) CONTENTS.—In conducting the study under sub-
2	section (a), the Secretary shall—
3	(1) evaluate the national significance of the
4	study area and the surrounding area;
5	(2) determine the suitability and feasibility of
6	designating the study area as an affiliated area of
7	the National Park System;
8	(3) consider other alternatives for the preserva-
9	tion, protection, and interpretation of the study area
10	by—
11	(A) the Federal Government;
12	(B) State or local governmental entities; or
13	(C) private or nonprofit organizations;
14	(4) consult with interested—
15	(A) Federal, State, or local governmental
16	entities;
17	(B) private or nonprofit organizations; or
18	(C) any other interested individuals; and
19	(5) identify cost estimates for any Federal ac-
20	quisition, development, interpretation, operation, and
21	maintenance associated with the alternatives consid-
22	ered under paragraph (3).
23	(c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study required under
24	subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with sec-
25	tion 8 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

(d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are first made available to carry out the
study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to
the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the
Senate and the Committee on Natural Resources of the
House of Representatives a report that contains a descrip tion of—

- 8 (1) the results of the study; and
- 9 (2) any conclusions and recommendations of the10 Secretary.
