To amend the Hate Crime Statistics Act to include crimes against the homeless.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Hate Crimes Against
- 5 the Homeless Statistics Act of 2009".
- 6 SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF HOMELESS.
- 7 Section (1)(b) of the Hate Crime Statistics Act is
- 8 amended—
- 9 (1) in paragraph (1), by inserting "homeless
- status," after "sexual orientation,"; and

1	(2) by adding the end the following:
2	"(6) As used in this subsection, the term
3	'homeless status' with respect to an individual, re-
4	fers to an individual who—
5	"(A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate
6	nighttime residence; or
7	"(B) has a primary nighttime residence
8	that is—
9	"(i) a public or private place not de-
10	signed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular
11	sleeping accommodation for human beings
12	including cars, parks, public spaces, aban-
13	doned buildings, substandard housing, bus
14	or train stations, or similar settings;
15	"(ii) a supervised publicly or privately
16	operated shelter designed to provide tem-
17	porary living accommodations, including
18	motels, hotels, congregate shelters, and
19	transitional housing; or
20	"(iii) housing of other persons in
21	which the individual is temporarily staying
22	due to loss of housing, economic hardship,
23	or a similar reason.".
