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**A BILL**

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to determine the suitability and feasibility of adding the Heart Mountain Relocation Center, in the State of Wyoming, as a unit of the National Park System.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “Heart Mountain Relo-  
3 cation Center Study Act of 2009”.

4 **SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.**

5       (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior shall con-  
6 duct a special resource study of the Heart Mountain Relo-  
7 cation Center, in Park County, Wyoming.

8       (b) CONTENTS.—In conducting the study under sub-  
9 section (a), the Secretary shall—

10           (1) evaluate the national significance of the  
11 Heart Mountain Relocation Center and surrounding  
12 area;

13           (2) determine the suitability and feasibility of  
14 designating the Heart Mountain Relocation Center  
15 as a unit of the National Park System;

16           (3) consider other alternatives for preservation,  
17 protection, and interpretation of the site by Federal,  
18 State, or local governmental entities, or private and  
19 nonprofit organizations;

20           (4) identify cost estimates for any Federal ac-  
21 quisition, development, interpretation, operation, and  
22 maintenance associated with the alternatives;

23           (5) identify any potential impacts of designation  
24 of the site as a unit of the National Park System  
25 on private landowners; and

1           (6) consult with interested Federal, State, or  
2       local governmental entities, federally recognized In-  
3       dian tribes, private and nonprofit organizations,  
4       owners of private property that may be affected by  
5       any such designation, or any other interested indi-  
6       viduals.

7       (c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study required under  
8       subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with sec-  
9       tion 8 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

10       (d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date  
11       on which funds are first made available for the study  
12       under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the  
13       Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Rep-  
14       resentatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural  
15       Resources of the Senate a report containing the results  
16       of the study and any conclusions and recommendations of  
17       the Secretary.
