## A BILL

To ban the sale, manufacture, distribution, and use in public facilities of drop-side cribs in the United States, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. BAN ON DROP-SIDE CRIBS.
- 4 (a) Drop-Side Crib Defined.—In this section, the
- 5 term "drop-side crib" means any infant crib that has at
- 6 least 1 side that moves up and down. Such term does not
- 7 include a drop-gate crib or any other crib that has immov-
- 8 able sides with a portion of 1 side capable of being folded
- 9 down.

- 1 (b) Ban.—Beginning on the date of the enactment
- 2 of this Act, every covered product shall be treated as a
- 3 banned hazardous product pursuant to a rule promulgated
- 4 under section 8 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15
- 5 U.S.C. 2057).
- 6 (c) COVERED PRODUCT.—For purposes of this sec-
- 7 tion, a covered product is any drop-side crib that is sold,
- 8 offered for sale, manufactured for sale, distributed in com-
- 9 merce, used in public facilities such as hotels or day care
- 10 centers, or imported into the United States on or after
- 11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
