A BILL

To ensure the safety of members of the United States Armed Forces while using expeditionary facilities, infrastructure, and equipment supporting United States military operations overseas.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring Safe Facili-
- 5 ties and Equipment for American Troops Overseas Act".

1	SEC. 2. CERTIFICATION OF SAFETY OF EXPEDITIONARY FA-
2	CILITIES, INFRASTRUCTURE, AND EQUIP-
3	MENT SUPPORTING UNITED STATES MILI-
4	TARY OPERATIONS OVERSEAS.
5	(a) CERTIFICATION REQUIRED.—In order to ensure
6	the safe utilization by the Armed Forces of expeditionary
7	facilities, infrastructure, and equipment supporting
8	United States military operations overseas, the Secretary
9	of Defense shall certify to the congressional defense com-
10	mittees, by not later than 60 days after the date of the
11	enactment of this Act, that each of the following actions
12	have been accomplished:
13	(1) That generally accepted industry standards
14	for the safety of personnel are incorporated into
15	military regulations establishing requirements for fa-
16	cilities, infrastructure, and equipment, including
17	standards with respect to fire protection and struc-
18	tural integrity, and standards with respect to elec-
19	trical systems, water treatment, and telecommuni-
20	cation networks.
21	(2) That each contract or task or delivery order
22	carried out for the construction, installation, repair,
23	maintenance, or operation of expeditionary facilities
24	for the Armed Forces overseas incorporates gen-
25	erally accepted industry standards for the safety of
