 6 Section 6002(c) of the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42)
 7 U.S.C. 6962(c)) is amended—
- 8 (1) by striking "(1) After the date" and insert-
- 9 ing the following:

1	"(1) IN GENERAL.—After the date";
2	(2) by redesignating paragraphs (2) and (3) as
3	paragraphs (4) and (5);
4	(3) in paragraph (1)(C)—
5	(A) by inserting "subject to paragraph
6	(3)," before "are only available"; and
7	(B) by striking the last sentence; and
8	(4) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
9	lowing:
10	"(2) Relationship to bureau of stand-
11	ARDS GUIDELINES.—Any determination under para-
12	graph (1)(B) shall be made on the basis of the
13	guidelines of the Bureau of Standards in any case
14	in which the material is covered by those guidelines.
15	"(3) Unreasonable price restriction.—
16	For a product containing at least 25 percent recov-
17	ered materials, a price in the amount of not more
18	than 110 percent of the bid price of the highest-
19	ranked competing product containing zero or de
20	minimis recovered materials shall not be considered
21	an unreasonable price under paragraph (1)(C).".
