## A BILL

To establish a point of order against certain climate change legislation.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. POINT OF ORDER AGAINST CLIMATE CHANGE
- 4 LEGISLATION.
- 5 (a) Point of Order.—Subject to subsection (b), it
- 6 shall not be in order in the Senate to consider any con-
- 7 ference report or other legislation that originates in the
- 8 House of Representatives as a message, bill, amendment,
- 9 or motion, or any Senate bill or related conference report
- 10 to which the House of Representatives added a provision,
- 11 that addresses climate change through the inclusion of a

- 1 cap-and-trade program if the Senate has not considered
- 2 and approved a bill addressing climate change that in-
- 3 cluded such a cap-and-trade program.
- 4 (b) WAIVER AND APPEAL.—
- 5 (1) WAIVER.—Subsection (a) may be waived or 6 suspended in the Senate only by an affirmative vote 7 of <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of the Members, duly chosen and sworn.
- 8 (2) APPEAL.—An affirmative vote of ½3 of the 9 Members of the Senate, duly chosen and sworn, shall 10 be required to sustain an appeal of the ruling of the 11 Chair on a point of order raised under subsection 12 (a).
