A BILL

To require a minimum number of transition assistance advisors in each State in connection with the Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Transition Assistance
- 5 Advisor Act".

1	SEC. 2. MINIMUM NUMBER OF TRANSITION ASSISTANCE
2	ADVISORS IN EACH STATE IN CONNECTION
3	WITH THE YELLOW RIBBON REINTEGRATION
4	PROGRAM.
5	(a) Minimum Number Required.—Section 582 of
6	the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
7	2008 (Public Law 110–181; 122 Stat. 122; 10 U.S.C.
8	10101 note) is amended by adding at the end the following
9	new subsection:
10	"(i) Transition Assistance Advisors.—
11	"(1) Minimum number of advisors in each
12	STATE.—As part of the Yellow Ribbon Reintegration
13	Program, the Secretary of Defense shall ensure that
14	the minimum number of Transition Assistance Advi-
15	sors (TAAs) in each State is as follows:
16	"(A) During the period beginning 180
17	days before the commencement of a contingency
18	operation (or, if later, as soon before as is oth-
19	erwise practicable) and ending 180 days after
20	the conclusion of such contingency operation,
21	not less than one Transition Assistance Advisor
22	for each 1,500 members of the Army National
23	Guard of the United States and the Air Na-
24	tional Guard of the United States who reside in
25	such State.

1	"(B) At any time not covered by subpara-
2	graph (A), not less than one Transition Assist-
3	ance Advisor for each 5,000 members of the
4	Army National Guard of the United States and
5	the Air National Guard of the United States
6	who reside in such State.
7	"(2) Definitions.—In this subsection:
8	"(A) The term 'contingency operation' has
9	the meaning given that term in section
10	101(a)(13) of title 10, United States Code.
11	"(B) The term 'State' means the several
12	States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the
13	District of Columbia, and the Virgin Islands.".
14	(b) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after the date
15	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense
16	shall submit to Congress a report setting forth a descrip-
17	tion of the efforts of the Secretary to implement the re-
18	quirements of subsection (i) of the National Defense Au-
19	thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008, as added by sub-
20	section (a) of this section.

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
