 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wage Theft Prevention
 - 5 Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. TOLLING OF STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS.
 - 7 Section 6 of the Portal-to-Portal Act (29 U.S.C. 255)
 - 8 is amended—

- 1 (1) by striking the period at the end inserting 2 "; and"; and
 - (2) by adding at the end the following:
 - "(e) with respect to any eventual cause of action described in this section, the running of the statutory periods of limitation set forth in this section shall be tolled from the date the Secretary of Labor provides notice to the employer of any investigation related to such cause of action, until the date the Secretary provides notice to the employer that such investigation has concluded.".
