## A BILL

To extend the termination date for the exemption of returning workers from the numerical limitations for temporary workers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Save Our Small and
- 5 Seasonal Businesses Act of 2009".

1	SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF RETURNING WORKER EXEMPTION
2	TO H-2B NUMERICAL LIMITATION.
3	(a) In General.—Section 214(g)(9)(A) of the Im-
4	migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1184(g)(9)(A) is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"(A) Subject to subparagraphs (B) and (C), an alien
7	who has already been counted toward the numerical limi-
8	tation under paragraph (1)(B) during any 1 of the 3 fiscal
9	years immediately prior to the fiscal year of the approved
10	start date of a petition for a nonimmigrant worker de-
11	scribed in section $101(a)(15)(H)(ii)(b)$ shall not again be
12	counted toward such limitation for the fiscal year for
13	which the petition is approved. Such an alien shall be con-
14	sidered a returning worker.".
15	(b) Effective Date; 3-Year Limitation; Sunset
16	Provision.—The amendment made by subsection (a)
17	shall—
18	(1) take effect as if enacted on December 1,
19	2008;
20	(2) apply only to petitions with an approved
21	start date in fiscal year 2009, 2010, or 2011; and
22	(3) terminate on the date that is 3 years after
23	the date of the enactment of this Act.
