Mr. LEVIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred
to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Sopuruchi Chukwueke.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
5 sion of law, for the purposes of the Immigration and Na-
6 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Sopuruchi
7 Chukwueke shall be deemed to have been lawfully admit-
8 ted to, and remained in, the United States, and shall be
9 eligible for adjustment of status to that of an alien law-
10 fully admitted for permanent residence under section 245
11 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255)
12 upon filing an application for such adjustment of status.

1 (b) APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Sub-
2 section (a) shall apply only if the application for adjust-
3 ment of status is filed with appropriate fees not later than
4 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

5 (c) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBERS.—
6 Upon the granting of permanent resident status to
7 Sopuruchi Chukwueke, the Secretary of State shall in-
8 struct the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the current
9 or next following fiscal year, the total number of immi-
10 grant visas that are made available to natives of the coun-
11 try of the birth of Sopuruchi Chukwueke under section
12 202(a)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
13 U.S.C. 1152(a)(2)).

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
