A BILL

To establish pilot projects under the Medicare program to provide incentives for home health agencies to utilize home monitoring and communications technologies.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fostering Independ-
- 5 ence Through Technology Act of 2009".
- 6 SEC. 2. REMOTE MONITORING PILOT PROJECTS.
- 7 (a) Pilot Projects.—
- 8 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 9 months
- 9 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-

1	retary of Health and Human Services (in this sec-
2	tion referred to as the "Secretary") shall conduct
3	pilot projects under title XVIII of the Social Secu-
4	rity Act for the purpose of providing incentives to
5	home health agencies to utilize home monitoring and
6	communications technologies that—
7	(A) enhance health outcomes for medicare
8	beneficiaries; and
9	(B) reduce expenditures under such title.
10	(2) Site requirements.—
11	(A) Urban and Rural.—The Secretary
12	shall conduct the pilot projects under this sec-
13	tion in both urban and rural areas.
14	(B) SITE IN A SMALL STATE.—The Sec-
15	retary shall conduct at least 1 of the pilot
16	projects in a State with a population of less
17	than 1,000,000.
18	(3) Definition of home health agency.—
19	In this section, the term "home health agency" has
20	the meaning given that term in section 1861(o) of
21	the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(o)).
22	(b) Medicare Beneficiaries Within the Scope
23	OF PROJECTS.—The Secretary shall specify the criteria
24	for identifying those medicare beneficiaries who shall be
25	considered within the scope of the pilot projects under this

1	section for purposes of the application of subsection (c)
2	and for the assessment of the effectiveness of the home
3	health agency in achieving the objectives of this section.
4	Such criteria may provide for the inclusion in the projects
5	of medicare beneficiaries who begin receiving home health
6	services under title XVIII of the Social Security Act after
7	the date of the implementation of the projects.
8	(c) Incentives.—
9	(1) Performance targets.—The Secretary
10	shall establish for each home health agency partici-
11	pating in a pilot project under this section a per-
12	formance target using one of the following meth-
13	odologies, as determined appropriate by the Sec-
14	retary:
15	(A) Adjusted historical performance
16	TARGET.—The Secretary shall establish for the
17	agency—
18	(i) a base expenditure amount equal
19	to the average total payments made to the
20	agency under parts A and B of title XVIII
21	of the Social Security Act for medicare
22	beneficiaries determined to be within the
23	scope of the pilot project in a base period
24	determined by the Secretary; and

- 1 (ii) an annual per capita expenditure 2 target for such beneficiaries, reflecting the 3 base expenditure amount adjusted for risk 4 and adjusted growth rates.
 - (B) Comparative performance target equal to the average total payments under such parts A and B during the pilot project for comparable individuals in the same geographic area that are not determined to be within the scope of the pilot project.
 - (2) Incentive.—Subject to paragraph (3), the Secretary shall pay to each participating home care agency an incentive payment for each year under the pilot project equal to a portion of the medicare savings realized for such year relative to the performance target under paragraph (1).
 - (3) LIMITATION ON EXPENDITURES.—The Secretary shall limit incentive payments under this section in order to ensure that the aggregate expenditures under title XVIII of the Social Security Act (including incentive payments under this subsection) do not exceed the amount that the Secretary esti-

- 1 mates would have been expended if the pilot projects
- 2 under this section had not been implemented.
- 3 (d) Waiver Authority.—The Secretary may waive
- 4 such provisions of titles XI and XVIII of the Social Secu-
- 5 rity Act as the Secretary determines to be appropriate for
- 6 the conduct of the pilot projects under this section.
- 7 (e) Report to Congress.—Not later than 5 years
- 8 after the date that the first pilot project under this section
- 9 is implemented, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a
- 10 report on the pilot projects. Such report shall contain a
- 11 detailed description of issues related to the expansion of
- 12 the projects under subsection (f) and recommendations for
- 13 such legislation and administrative actions as the Sec-
- 14 retary considers appropriate.
- 15 (f) Expansion.—If the Secretary determines that
- 16 any of the pilot projects under this section enhance health
- 17 outcomes for Medicare beneficiaries and reduce expendi-
- 18 tures under title XVIII of the Social Security Act, the Sec-
- 19 retary may initiate comparable projects in additional
- 20 areas.
- 21 (g) Incentive Payments Have No Effect on
- 22 OTHER MEDICARE PAYMENTS TO AGENCIES.—An incen-
- 23 tive payment under this section—
- 24 (1) shall be in addition to the payments that a
- 25 home health agency would otherwise receive under

- title XVIII of the Social Security Act for the provision of home health services; and
- 3 (2) shall have no effect on the amount of such4 payments.
