4	(a) In General.—Chapter 53 of title 10, United
5	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1060b
6	the following new section:
7	"§ 1060c. Travel on military aircraft: certain disabled

9	"The Secretary of Defense shall permit any former
10	member of the armed forces who is entitled to compensa-
11	tion under the laws administered by the Secretary of Vet-
12	erans Affairs for a service-connected disability rated as
13	total to travel, in the same manner and to the same extent
14	as retired members of the armed forces, on unscheduled
15	military flights within the continental United States and
16	on scheduled overseas flights operated by the Air Mobility
17	Command. The Secretary of Defense shall permit such
18	travel on a space-available basis.".
19	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
20	at the beginning of chapter 53 of such title is amended
21	by inserting after the item relating to section 1060b the
22	following new item:

"1060c. Travel on military aircraft: certain disabled former members of the armed forces.".
