A BILL

To expand the Alpine Lakes Wilderness in the State of Washington, to designate the Middle Fork Snoqualmie River and Pratt River as wild and scenic rivers, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Alpine Lakes Wilder-
- 3 ness Additions and Pratt and Middle Fork Snoqualmie
- 4 Rivers Protection Act".

5 SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ALPINE LAKES WILDERNESS.

- 6 (a) In General.—There is designated as wilderness
- 7 and as a component of the National Wilderness Preserva-
- 8 tion System certain Federal land in the Mount Baker-
- 9 Snoqualmie National Forest in the State of Washington
- 10 comprising approximately 22,100 acres, as generally de-
- 11 picted on the map entitled "Proposed Alpine Lakes Wil-
- 12 derness Additions" and dated March 23, 2009, which is
- 13 incorporated in and shall be considered to be a part of
- 14 the Alpine Lakes Wilderness.
- 15 (b) ADMINISTRATION.—
- 16 (1) Management.—Subject to valid existing
- 17 rights, the land designated as wilderness by sub-
- section (a) shall be administered by the Secretary of
- 19 Agriculture (referred to in this section as the "Sec-
- 20 retary"), in accordance with the Wilderness Act (16
- 21 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.), except that any reference in
- 22 that Act to the effective date of that Act shall be
- 23 considered to be a reference to the date of enact-
- 24 ment of this Act.
- 25 (2) Map and description.—

1	(A) In General.—As soon as practicable
2	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
3	retary shall file a map and a legal description
4	of each wilderness area designated by sub-
5	section (a) with—
6	(i) the Committee on Natural Re-
7	sources of the House of Representatives;
8	and
9	(ii) the Committee on Energy and
10	Natural Resources of the Senate.
11	(B) FORCE OF LAW.—A map and legal de-
12	scription filed under subparagraph (A) shall
13	have the same force and effect as if included in
14	this Act, except that the Secretary may correct
15	errors in the map and legal description.
16	(C) Public availability.—Each map
17	and legal description filed under subparagraph
18	(A) shall be filed and made available for public
19	inspection in the appropriate office of the Sec-
20	retary.
21	(c) Incorporation of Acquired Land and Inter-
22	EST.—Any land within the boundary of the land des-
23	ignated as wilderness by subsection (a) that is acquired
24	by the United States shall—
25	(1) become part of the wilderness area; and

1	(2) be managed in accordance with subsection
2	(b)(1).
3	SEC. 3. WILD AND SCENIC RIVER DESIGNATIONS.
4	Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
5	U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6	lowing:
7	"(171) MIDDLE FORK SNOQUALMIE, WASH-
8	INGTON.—The 27.4-mile segment from the head-
9	waters of the Middle Fork Snoqualmie River near
10	La Bohn Gap in NE 1/4 sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13
11	E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11, T. 23 N.,
12	R. 9 E., to be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
13	culture in the following classifications:
14	"(A) The approximately 6.4-mile segment
15	from the headwaters of the Middle Fork
16	Snoqualmie River near La Bohn Gap in NE 1/4
17	sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13 E., to the west section
18	line of sec. 3, T. 23 N., R. 12 E., as a wild
19	river.
20	"(B) The approximately 21-mile segment
21	from the west section line of sec. 3, T. 23 N.,
22	R. 12 E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11,
23	T. 23 N., R. 9 E., as a seenic river.
24	"(172) Pratt river, washington.—The en-
25	tirety of the Pratt River in the State of Washington,

- 1 located in the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie National
- 2 Forest, to be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
- 3 culture as a wild river.".

4 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 5 This Act may be cited as the "Alpine Lakes Wilderness
- 6 Additions and Pratt and Middle Fork Snoqualmie Rivers
- 7 Protection Act".

8 SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ALPINE LAKES WILDERNESS.

- 9 (a) In General.—There is designated as wilderness
- 10 and as a component of the National Wilderness Preserva-
- 11 tion System certain Federal land in the Mount Baker-
- 12 Snoqualmie National Forest in the State of Washington
- 13 comprising approximately 22,173 acres that is within the
- 14 Proposed Alpine Lakes Wilderness Additions Boundary, as
- 15 generally depicted on the map entitled "Proposed Alpine
- 16 Lakes Wilderness Additions" and dated December 3, 2009,
- 17 which is incorporated in and shall be considered to be a
- 18 part of the Alpine Lakes Wilderness.

19 *(b)* Administration.—

- 20 (1) Management.—Subject to valid existing
- 21 rights, the land designated as wilderness by subsection
- 22 (a) shall be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
- culture (referred to in this section as the "Secretary"),
- in accordance with the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C.
- 25 1131 et seq.), except that any reference in that Act to

1	the effective date of that Act shall be considered to be
2	a reference to the date of enactment of this Act.
3	(2) Map and description.—
4	(A) In general.—As soon as practicable
5	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
6	retary shall file a map and a legal description
7	of the land designated as wilderness by sub-
8	section (a) with—
9	(i) the Committee on Natural Re-
10	sources of the House of Representatives; and
11	(ii) the Committee on Energy and Nat-
12	ural Resources of the Senate.
13	(B) Force of LAW.—A map and legal de-
14	scription filed under subparagraph (A) shall
15	have the same force and effect as if included in
16	this Act, except that the Secretary may correct
17	minor errors in the map and legal description.
18	(C) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—The map and
19	legal description filed under subparagraph (A)
20	shall be filed and made available for public in-
21	spection in the appropriate office of the Forest
22	Service.
23	(c) Incorporation of Acquired Land and Inter-
24	ESTS IN LAND.—Any land or interests in land within the
25	Proposed Alpine Lakes Wilderness Additions Boundary, as

1	generally depicted on the map entitled "Proposed Alpine					
2	Lakes Wilderness Additions" and dated December 3, 2009,					
3	that is acquired by the United States shall—					
4	(1) become part of the wilderness area; and					
5	(2) be managed in accordance with subsection					
6	<i>(b)(1).</i>
