A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a national cemetery in the Sarpy County region to serve veterans in eastern Nebraska, western Iowa, and northwest Missouri.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL CEMETERY IN
- 4 THE SARPY COUNTY REGION.
- 5 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
- 6 shall establish, in accordance with chapter 24 of title 38,
- 7 United States Code, a national cemetery in the Sarpy

- 1 County region to serve the needs of veterans and their
- 2 families.
- 3 (b) Consultation in Selection of Site.—Before
- 4 selecting the site for the national cemetery established
- 5 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall consult with—
- 6 (1) appropriate officials of the State of Ne-
- 7 braska and local officials in the Sarpy County re-
- 8 gion; and
- 9 (2) appropriate officials of the Federal Govern-
- ment, including the Administrator of General Serv-
- ices, with respect to land belonging to the Federal
- Government in that area that would be suitable to
- establish the national cemetery under subsection (a).
- 14 (c) Authority To Accept Donation of Parcel
- 15 OF LAND.—
- 16 (1) In General.—The Secretary of Veterans
- 17 Affairs may accept on behalf of the United States
- the gift of an appropriate parcel of real property.
- 19 The Secretary shall have administrative jurisdiction
- over such parcel of real property, and shall use such
- 21 parcel to establish the national cemetery under sub-
- section (a).
- 23 (2) Income tax treatment of gift.—For
- purposes of Federal income, estate, and gift taxes,

- 1 the real property accepted under paragraph (1) shall
- 2 be considered as a gift to the United States.
- 3 (d) Report.—As soon as practicable after the date
- 4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit
- 5 to Congress a report on the establishment of the national
- 6 cemetery under subsection (a). The report shall set forth
- 7 a schedule for such establishment and an estimate of the
- 8 costs associated with such establishment.
- 9 (e) SARPY COUNTY REGION DEFINED.—In this Act,
