RESOLUTION

Prohibiting text messaging by employees of the Senate while driving on official business.

1	Resolved,
2	SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON TEXT MESSAGING BY EM-
3	PLOYEES OF THE SENATE WHILE DRIVING
4	ON OFFICIAL BUSINESS.
5	(a) Definitions.—In this resolution—
6	(1) the term "employee of the Senate" means
7	any employee whose pay is disbursed by the Sec-
8	retary of the Senate; and
9	(2) the term "text messaging" means reading
10	from or entering data into any handheld or other

1	electronic device, including for the purpose of SMS
2	texting, e-mailing, instant messaging, obtaining navi-
3	gational information, or engaging in any other form
4	of electronic data retrieval or electronic data commu-
5	nication.
6	(b) Prohibition.—An employee of the Senate may
7	not engage in text messaging when—
8	(1) driving a Government owned or leased vehi-
9	cle;
0	(2) driving a privately owned or leased vehicle
1	while on official business; or
2	(3) using text messaging equipment provided by
3	any office or committee of the Senate while driving
4	any vehicle at any time.
5	(c) Effective Date and Application.—This reso-
6	lution shall apply to the 111th Congress and each Con-
