 - 1 *Resolved*, That the memorial observances of the Hon-
 - 2 orable Robert C. Byrd, late a Senator from the State of
 - 3 West Virginia be held in the Senate Chamber on Thurs-
 - 4 day, July 1, 2010, beginning at 10:00 a.m., and that the
 - 5 Senate attend the same.

Resolved, That paragraph 1 of Rule IV of the Rules
for the Regulation of the Senate Wing of the United
States Capitol (prohibiting the taking of pictures in the
Senate Chamber) be temporarily suspended for the sole
and specific purpose of permitting the Senate Photo graphic Studio to photograph this memorial observance.
Resolved, That the Sergeant at Arms be directed to

8 make necessary and appropriate arrangements in connec9 tion with the memorial observances in the Senate Cham10 ber.

11 Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate commu-12 nicate these resolutions to the House of Representatives, 13 transmit an enrolled copy thereof to the family of the de-14 ceased, and invite the House of Representatives and the 15 family of the deceased to attend the memorial observances 16 in the Senate Chamber.

17 Resolved, That invitations be extended to the President of the United States, the Vice President of the 18 19 United States, and the members of the Cabinet, the Chief 20 Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of 21 the United States, the Diplomatic Corps (through the Sec-22 retary of State), the Chief of Staff of the Army, the Chief 23 of Naval Operations of the Navy, the Major General Com-24 mandant of the Marine Corps, the Chief of Staff of the

1 Air Force, and the Commandant of the Coast Guard to

2 attend the memorial observances in the Senate Chamber.
