- 7 of the Senate, the minority leader of the Senate, the
- 8 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the minority
- 9 leader of the House of Representatives, in consultation

- 1 with the Architect of the Capitol, for a ceremony to honor
- 2 the longest surviving veteran of the First World War, Mr.
- 3 Frank Woodruff Buckles, as a tribute and recognition of
- 4 all United States military members who served in the
- 5 First World War.
- 6 (b) Implementation.—Physical preparations for
- 7 the ceremony shall be carried out in accordance with such
- 8 conditions as the Architect of the Capitol may prescribe.
