Mr. STEARNS introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States restoring religious freedom.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled

3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-

4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
9 for ratification:

"ARTICLE —

2 "SECTION 1. To secure the people's right to acknowl-3 edge God according to the dictates of conscience: The people's right to pray and to recognize their religious beliefs, 4 heritage, or traditions on public property, including 5 schools, shall not be infringed. The Government shall not 6 require any person to join in prayer or other religious ac-7 tivity, initiate or designate school prayers, discriminate 8 against religion, or deny equal access to a benefit on ac-9 count of religion.". 10
