JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to allow the several States to nullify a law or regulation of the United States.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1 "ARTICLE—

2 "Whenever the legislatures of two-thirds of the sev3 eral States approve resolutions to nullify the same law or
4 executive regulation of the United States, such law or ex5 ecutive regulation shall be null and void and any portion
6 of another law or executive regulation amended by the nul7 lifted law or executive regulation shall be deemed to read
8 as if the repealed law or executive regulation had not been
9 enacted."
