- 4 "The Congress, on application of the legislatures of
- 5 two-thirds of the several states, which all contain an iden-
- 6 tical amendment, shall call a convention solely to decide
- 7 whether to propose that specific amendment to the States,
- 8 which, if proposed, shall be valid to all intents and pur-
- 9 poses as part of this Constitution when ratified pursuant
- 10 to Article V.".
