JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when

- 1 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 2 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 3 for ratification:
- 4 "Article—
- 5 "Any provision of law or regulation of the United
- 6 States may be repealed by the several states, and such
- 7 repeal shall be effective when the legislatures of two-thirds
- 8 of the several states approve resolutions for this purpose
- 9 that particularly describe the same provision or provisions
- 10 of law or regulation to be repealed.".
