JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States regarding the effect of treaties, Executive orders, and agreements with other nations or groups of nations.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1 "Article—

2 "No treaty, Executive order, or any agreement with 3 any nation or group of nations or any of the provisions 4 of such agreements, shall be construed to diminish any 5 of the rights or privileges guaranteed to citizens of the 6 United States under the Constitution of the United States,

7 and Federal law.".
