A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to establish the position of National Nurse for Public Health.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Nurse Act
- 5 of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.
- 7 Title XVII of the Public Health Service Act (42
- 8 U.S.C. 300u et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
- 9 the following:

1 "SEC. 1711, NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.

1	SEC. 1711, IMITONIAL NOUSE FOR TOBER HEALTH.
2	"(a) Establishment.—
3	"(1) In general.—There is established within
4	the Office of the Surgeon General a full-time posi-
5	tion, to be filled by registered nurse to be known as
6	the National Nurse for Public Health.
7	"(2) Procedure.—Except for the initial ap-
8	pointment of the National Nurse for Public Health
9	under paragraph (3), the Secretary shall appoint the
10	National Nurse for Public Health in accordance with
11	Commissioned Corps Instruction CC23.4.6 (relating
12	to Chief Professional Officer Nominations), as in ef-
13	fect on February 13, 2008.
14	"(3) Initial appointment.—Not later than
15	30 days after the date of enactment of this section,
16	the Secretary shall appoint the individual serving as
17	the Chief Nurse Officer of the Public Health Service
18	as of the date of the enactment of this section as the
19	first National Nurse for Public Health.
20	"(b) Rank and Grade.—The National Nurse for
21	Public Health shall have the same rank and grade as the
22	Deputy Surgeon General of the Public Health Service.
23	"(c) Duties.—The National Nurse for Public Health
24	shall carry out the following:
25	"(1) Provide leadership and coordination of

Public Health Service nursing professional affairs

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- for the Office of the Surgeon General and other agencies of the Public Health Service, including providing representation for the Government of the United States at the Global Forum for Government Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers and serving as a member of the Federal Nursing Service Council.
 - "(2) Represent the Surgeon General and the agencies of Public Health Service in communications with groups and societies concerned with nursing issues at the local, State, national, and international levels.
 - "(3) Provide guidance and advice to the Surgeon General and the Nurse Professional Advisory Committee on matters such as standards, recruitment, retention, readiness, and career development of nurses employed by and contracted with agencies of the Public Health Service.
 - "(4) Conduct media campaigns and make personal appearances for purposes of paragraphs (5) through (7).
 - "(5) Provide guidance and leadership for activities to promote the public health, including encouraging nurses and other health professionals to be volunteers and developing projects that educate the

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- public about and engage the public in prevention
 practices to achieve better health.
- "(6) Provide guidance and leadership to encourage nurses to engage in furthering their education in order to conduct nursing research, increase the awareness of evidence-based practice, and educate future nurses.
- 8 "(7) Provide guidance and leadership for activi-9 ties that will increase public safety and emergency 10 preparedness.
- 11 "(d) National Health Priorities—Healthy 12 People 2020.—
- 13 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The National Nurse for 14 Public Health, in cooperation with the Surgeon Gen-15 eral of the Public Health Service, heads of the agen-16 cies of the Public Health Service, States, and orga-17 nizations that represent health professionals, shall 18 participate in the identification of national health 19 priorities.
 - "(2) Addressing National Health Priorities.—The National Nurse for Public Health, in addressing national health priorities, shall encourage volunteerism of nurses and other individuals, and strengthen the relationship between Government agencies and health-related national organizations.

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1	"(3) Community-based projects.—
2	"(A) Implementation.—In addressing
3	national health priorities, the National Nurse
4	for Public Health shall—
5	"(i) provide guidance and coordination
6	on recommended activities to organiza-
7	tions;
8	"(ii) acknowledge successful programs
9	and encourage their replication;
10	"(iii) promote the dissemination of
11	evidence-based practice in educating the
12	public on health promotion and disease
13	prevention activities;
14	"(iv) encourage practicing nurses and
15	other health professionals, including retired
16	health professionals and students enrolled
17	in health professional programs, to partici-
18	pate in health promotion activities and rep-
19	licate successful health promotion activi-
20	ties; and
21	"(v) monitor activities being con-
22	ducted through the collection and evalua-
23	tion of data to determine if national health
24	priorities are being addressed.

"(B) Media campaigns.—The National Nurse for Public Health shall ensure that media campaigns conducted under subsection (c)(4) include media campaigns regarding the national health priorities.

"(C) EVALUATIONS.—The National Nurse for Public Health shall, directly or through awards of grants or contracts, evaluate the activities encouraged by the National Nurse for Public Health and conducted by community-based, nonprofit organizations to determine the extent to which such activities have succeeded in carrying out national health priorities.

"(D) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—
The National Nurse for Public Health shall disseminate information to governmental agencies, schools, and community-based, nonprofit organizations interested in health promotion and improving public health through community action.

"(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For carrying out this section, there are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2012 through 2016.".
