## A BILL

To establish an Oleoresin Capsicum Spray Pilot Program in the Bureau of Prisons, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Oleoresin Capsicum
- 5 Spray Pilot Program Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. OLEORESIN CAPSICUM SPRAY PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (a) PILOT PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.—The Director of
- 8 the Federal Bureau of Prisons shall conduct a pilot pro-
- 9 gram to determine the effectiveness of the routine issuance
- 10 of Oleoresin Capsicum spray to staff.

1	(b) Scope of Pilot Program.—The Director of the
2	Federal Bureau of Prisons shall have the discretion to—
3	(1) select the specific Bureau of Prisons institu-
4	tion or institutions participating in the pilot pro-
5	gram;
6	(2) determine the length (but not to exceed 2
7	years) of the pilot program;
8	(3) select the type of Oleoresin Capsicum spray
9	device utilized in the pilot program; and
10	(4) determine which Bureau of Prisons staff
11	will be authorized to participate in the pilot pro-
12	gram.
13	(c) Requirements Subject to Availability of
14	APPROPRIATIONS.—The requirements of this section are
15	subject to the availability of appropriations.
16	(d) GAO Report.—The Government Accountability
17	Office shall, not later than six months after the end of
18	the pilot program, report to Congress an evaluation of the
19	effects of the pilot program and provide any research and
20	analysis that Office determines appropriate on tools to im-
21	prove officer safety in Federal prisons.
