5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any amounts appropriated for Members' Rep-6 7 resentational Allowances for the House of Representatives 8 for a fiscal year which remain after all payments are made 9 under such Allowances for the year shall be deposited in the Treasury and used for deficit reduction, except that 10 11 in the case of a fiscal year for which there is no Federal budget deficit, such amounts shall be used to reduce the 12 13 Federal debt (in such manner as the Secretary of the Treasury considers appropriate). 14

(b) REGULATIONS.—The Committee on House Administration shall promulgate such regulations as may be
necessary to carry out this section.

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply withrespect to fiscal year 2011 and each succeeding fiscal year.
