1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. DENIAL OF PAY ADJUSTMENTS FOR UNSATIS-

4 FACTORY PERFORMANCE.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5303 of title 5, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing:

"(h)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, an adjustment under this section shall not be made in the case of any employee of the Department of Defense having an unacceptable performance rating.

"(2) For purposes of administering any provision of 5 6 law, rule, or regulation which—

"(A) provides premium pay, retirement, life in-7 surance, or any other employee benefit which re-8 9 quires any deduction or contribution,

10 "(B) imposes any requirement or limitation, or 11 "(C) requires any other computation (such as 12 under section 5304(c)(1)(B)),

on the basis of a rate of basic pay, the rate of basic pay 13 payable after the application of paragraph (1) shall be 14 15 treated as the rate of basic pay for the employee involved.". 16

17 (b) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the Office of Personnel 18 19 Management, may prescribe any regulations necessary to carry out the purposes of this section. 20
