#### A BILL

To establish the Waco Mammoth National Monument in the State of Texas, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-					
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,					
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.					
4	This Act may be cited as the "Waco Mammoth No					
5	tional Monument Establishment Act of 2011".					
6	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.					
7	Congress finds that—					
8	8 (1) the Waco Mammoth Site area is located no					
9	9 the confluence of the Brazos River and the Bosq					
10	0 River in central Texas, near the city of Waco;					
11	(2) after the discovery of bones emerging from					
12	eroding creek banks leading to the uncovering of por-					
13	3 tions of 5 mammoths, Baylor University began inve					
14	tigating the site in 1978;					
15	(3) several additional mammoth remains have					
16	been uncovered making the site the largest known con-					
17	centration of mammoths dying from the same event;					
18	(4) the mammoth discoveries have received inter-					
19	national attention; and					
20	(5) Baylor University and the city of Waco,					
21	Texas, have been working together—					
22	(A) to protect the site; and					
23	(B) to develop further research and edu-					
24	cational opportunities at the site.

3	(1) City.—The term "City" means the city of						
4	Waco, Texas.						
5	(2) Management plan.—The term "manage						
6	ment plan" means the management plan for th						
7	Monument prepared under section $5(c)(1)$ .						
8	(3) MAP.—The term "map" means the map enti-						
9	tled "Proposed Boundary Waco-Mammoth National						
10	Monument", numbered T21/80,000, and dated April						
11	2009.						
12	(4) Monument.—The term "Monument" means						
13	3 the Waco Mammoth National Monument establish						
14	by section $4(a)$ .						
15	(5) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means						
16	the Secretary of the Interior.						
17	(6) State.—The term "State" means the State						
18	of Texas.						
19	(7) University.—The term "University" means						
20	Baylor University in the State.						
21	SEC. 4. WACO MAMMOTH NATIONAL MONUMENT, TEXAS.						
22	(a) Establishment.—There is established in the						
23	State, as a unit of the National Park System, the Waco						
24	Mammoth National Monument, as generally depicted on the						
25	map.						

1	(b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file					
2	2 and available for public inspection in the appropriate					
3	3 fices of the National Park Service.					
4	4 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF MONUMENT.					
5	(a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer the					
6	6 Monument in accordance with—					
7	(1) this Act; and					
8	(2) any cooperative agreements entered into					
9	$under\ subsection\ (b)(1).$					
10	(b) Authorities of Secretary.—					
11	(1) Cooperative agreements.—The Secretary					
12	may enter into cooperative management agreements					
13	with the University and the City, in accordance with					
14	section 3(l) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a					
15	2(1)).					
16	(2) Acquisition of Land.—The Secretary may					
17	acquire by donation only from the City any land or					
18	interest in land owned by the City within the pro-					
19	posed boundary of the Monument.					
20	(c) General Management Plan.—					
21	(1) In general.—Not later than 3 years after					
22	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in					
23	consultation with the University and the City, shall					
24	complete a general management plan for the Monu-					
25	ment.					

1	(2) Inclusions.—The management plan shall						
2	include, at a minimum—						
3	(A) measures for the preservation of the r						
4	sources of the Monument;						
5	(B) requirements for the type and extent						
6	development and use of the Monument;						
7	7 (C) identification of the capacity of						
8	Monument for accommodating visitors; and						
9	9 (D) opportunities for involvement by						
10	0 University, City, State, and other local and r						
11	1 tional entities in—						
12	(i) developing educational programs						
13	for the Monument; and						
14	(ii) developing and supporting the						
15	Monument.						
16	(d) Prohibition of Use of Federal Funds.—No						
17	Federal funds may be used to pay the costs of—						
18	(1) carrying out a cooperative agreement under						
19	subsection (b)(1);						
20	(2) acquiring land for inclusion in the Monu						
21	$ment\ under\ subsection\ (b)(2);$						
22	(3) developing a visitor center for the Monument						
23	(4) operating or maintaining the Monument;						
24	(5) constructing exhibits for the Monument; or						

1	(6) developing the general management plan							
2	under subsection (c).							
3	3 (e) USE OF NON-FEDERAL FUNDS.—Non-Federa							
4	funds may be used to pay any costs that may be incurred							
5	by the Secretary or the National Park Service in carrying							
6	out this section.							
7	7 (f) Effect on Eligibility for Financial Assis							
8	8 ANCE.—Nothing in this Act affects the eligibility of t							
9	Monument for Federal grants or other forms of financia							
10	assistance that the Monument would have been eligible to							
11	apply for had National Park System status not been con-							
12	ferred to the Monument under this Act.							
13	(g) Termination of National Park System Sta							
14	TUS.—							
15	(1) In General.—Designation of the Monument							
16	as a unit of the National Park System shall termi-							
17	nate if the Secretary determines that Federal funds							
18	are required to operate and maintain the Monument.							
19	(2) Reversion.—If the designation of the Monu-							
20	ment as a unit of the National Park System is termi-							
21	nated under paragraph (1), any land acquired by the							
22	Secretary from the City under subsection (b)(2) shall							
23	revert to the City.							

- 1 (h) Private Property Protection.—No private
- 2 property may be made part of the Monument without the
- 3 written consent of the owner of that private property.
- 4 SEC. 6. NO BUFFER ZONES.
- Nothing in this Act, the establishment of national
- 6 monument, or the management plan shall be construed cre-
- 7 ate buffer zones outside of the national monument. That an
- 8 activity or use can be seen or heard from within the Monu-
- 9 ment shall not preclude the conduct of that activity or use
- 10 outside the Monument.

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
