To amend title 23, United States Code, to exempt maintenance activities from certain analysis requirements.

- 3 SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES
- 4 FROM CERTAIN ANALYSIS REQUIREMENTS.
- 5 Section 116 of title 23, United States Code, is
- 6 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 7 "(e) Exemption of Maintenance Activities
- 8 From Certain Analysis Requirements.—In main-

- 1 taining the Federal-aid system to include construction oc-
- 2 curring within existing rights-of-way previously acquired
- 3 and reserved for transportation purposes pursuant to this
- 4 section, a State department of transportation shall not be
- 5 required to secure any permit or conduct any analysis
- 6 under Federal law (including any permit, review, analysis,
- 7 clearance, or impact statement under the National Envi-
- 8 ronmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.),
- 9 the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251
- 10 et seq.), the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401 et seq.), the
- 11 Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.),
- 12 or the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470
- 13 et seq.)).".
